

Help us clear up Glenpool's reputation!!!

Citizens of Glenpool have expressed concerns about a number of serious issues regarding City management and the procedures the City has followed for the past several years. A partial list includes:

- Possible violations of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and Open Records Act.
- Possible irregularities in city purchasing procedures, including possible violations of the Public Competitive Bidding Act.
- Potential improprieties in the issuance of various City and Utility Authority bond issues.
- Possible violation of State Statutes in negotiating the employment contract with the current City Manager.

These are items which do not appear to have been adequately addressed by City Management. The ability of the public to address and examine these issues from a broader perspective, instead of being limited to a generalized accounting review, such as the annual financial audit, is, in the opinion of a significant number of concerned citizens including the current and two previous Mayors of Glenpool, an appropriate action. That is why we are requesting the office of the State Auditor and Inspector to address these topics and various other related issues regarding the methods and procedures used which may have led to the inappropriate use of public funds.

The request requires the signature of over 500 residents of Glenpool (registered voters only) by **Tuesday, February 21, 2012.**

Whether or not these are valid concerns, this approach is the only current avenue available to the citizens of Glenpool. We believe that these concerns should be addressed directly and

eliminate any air of uncertainty regarding the ongoing operations of the City.

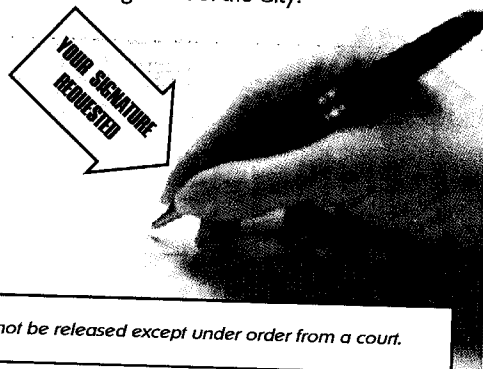
This is an opportunity for the City to obtain an impartial, independent and authoritative review of the operations of the City and its management team.

Any improprieties, irregularities, manipulation or willful disregard and/or violation of State Statutes would be referred to an appropriate supervisory, regulatory or judicial State agency for appropriate action. These would be far more serious than what are currently being labeled or dismissed as mere 'personality conflicts' or 'differences of opinion.'

Should discrepancies be disclosed by the audit that are simply regarded as procedural or that are capable of being resolved by more clearly defined authority and responsibility or by improved accountability reporting by management to elected officials, then such an audit would provide a blueprint for implementation and adoption.

If, on the other hand, it is determined that the City has complied with all state statutes and that there have been absolutely no inappropriate actions taken or managerial decisions made, this special audit will put to rest the public's concerns with a finality that only such an audit can provide.

In either event, the best interests of the Citizens of Glenpool will be served. The City can refocus its attention back to the needs of the community and the Citizens can have a restored confidence in the management of the City.
